


# How to Dispose of Garbage/ Bringing Waste to the Recycling Plaza

## Notes on Putting Garbage Out for Collection

- Place your garbage and recyclable waste at the collection site **by 8:00 am** on the collection day.
- Always put burnable waste in bags designated for Burnable Waste.** There is no designated bag for **recyclable waste** or **hazardous waste**, but please separate your items into cans, glass bottles, non-burnable garbage, PET bottles, and plastics, and put them out in **transparent or semi-transparent plastic bags up to 45 L**. For hazardous waste, please sort out batteries, fluorescent tubes, thermometers, spray cans, and lighters, and put them out separately. **(You can also use the bags previously used for recyclable waste. See the page “Bags You Can Use for Recyclable Waste.”)**
- Always tie bags closed without using tape or string.** Items sticking out of a bag, or covered with two bags, cannot be collected; please dispose of them as large-sized waste. **(See page on Non-Burnable Waste)**

## Notes on Bringing Waste to the Recycling Plaza

- Referring to the above “Notes on Putting Garbage Out for Collection”, separate your large-sized waste that is too big for garbage bags (up to 45 L) from your other garbage that goes into garbage bags. **(See relevant pages)**
- Large-sized waste, for which a fee is charged, and garbage in garbage bags (up to 45 L), for which no fee is charged, will be weighed separately. Refer to the diagram below when loading on your vehicle, so that your garbage can be unloaded smoothly.
- Vehicles bringing in waste must not exceed a **maximum load capacity of 3,000 kg**. However, vehicles with a maximum load capacity of 2,000 kg or more may be limited in the number of trips per day, depending on congestion at the Recycling Plaza. **Please refrain from using container vehicles (e.g., trailers) or tarp-covered vehicles whenever possible, and do not stack your waste too high.**
- The person who brings in waste must unload it. **If it is difficult to unload alone, please bring a second person.**
- Show your driver’s license or other ID** when you arrive.
- Unloading times are **from 8:30 am to 12:00 pm and from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm.**

### \* Note!

Put burnable waste in designated bags, and put recyclable waste in transparent or semi-transparent plastic bags up to 45 L, and separate them from large-sized waste.



Vehicles with a maximum load capacity of 3,000 kg or less may be used. However, vehicles with a maximum load capacity of 2,000 kg or more may be limited in the number of trips.




Load large-sized waste that does not fit into garbage bags (up to 45 L) separately from garbage that does fit into garbage bags.



Your driver’s license or other ID is required when you arrive. Please do not forget it.



The person who brings in garbage must unload it. Please come prepared for that.



### \* Waste brought in by a proxy or a contractor

#### (1) Proxy

It is often the case that someone else brings in the waste on behalf of the person who is disposing of it. However, since we need to check the source of the waste, we kindly ask that **the person disposing of it accompany the waste when bringing it in**, whenever possible.

#### (2) Contractor

Waste may only be brought to the Recycling Plaza by a contractor that has a collection and transportation permit from the municipal government. **To have a contractor bring in your waste, you must contact the relevant section of the municipal government about licensed contractors.**

# Burnable Waste


Always put out in **bags designated for Burnable Waste**.



**\* Note!** Never put metal or other non-burnable items inside!

## Leaves and pruned branches

Branches must be no thicker than 3 cm. Pruned branches may be brought to the Taki Town Beautification Center as is. No bag is required. (For details, see the back cover.)




## Textiles

Zippers and buttons may be left on.



## Leather

If metal fittings cannot be removed from a bag, etc., dispose of it as **Non-Burnable Waste**.



## Long or wide items

**Cut** long items into pieces of 50 cm or less. **Cut** wide items into pieces of 1 square meter or less.




## Cool packs, disposable heat pads, cooking oil

(Harden oil or soak it onto paper or cloth)




## Product plastic

buckets, video tapes, cassette tapes, CDs, game software, floppy discs, straws, etc.




## Paper

Put as much used paper out for local resource collection as possible.



## Aluminum wrap

Dispose of aluminum wrap and other thin aluminum waste as burnable waste.



## Food waste, etc.

Drain as much as possible.

Do not put food scraps or diapers in with Plastics (Recyclable Waste).



- Plastics other than containers and packaging are Burnable Waste.
- Plastics that are difficult to separate may be put with Burnable Waste.
- Hangers and futon compression bags with the plastic mark should be disposed of as Burnable Waste.


# Plastics (Recyclable Waste)

Put them out in **transparent** or **semi-transparent plastic bags** up to **45 L**.

Plastic food containers should be washed and dried before putting them out on **Plastics** day.



Wrapping used for packaging is also Plastics.



## Caps, labels

- If stains cannot be removed, dispose of them as Burnable Waste.

The "Plastic" mark cannot be printed on small items such as caps, so the label or other part of the product will indicate which parts are plastic.

Items with the plastic mark are accepted.

# PET Bottles (Recyclable Waste)

Put them out in **transparent** or **semi-transparent plastic bags** up to **45 L**.

**\* Note! Do not double-bag PET bottles. No double-bagging**

For beverage bottles with the PET mark remove the lid, remove the contents, rinse, and separate as PET bottles. **If a handle is attached, it may be left on.**



**Separate them from Plastics.**

• Separate caps and removed labels as "Plastics."

After March 31, 2026, designated bags will no longer be required for recyclable waste.

Recyclable waste may be put out in **transparent or semi-transparent plastic bags up to 45 L.** You may also **continue to use your existing Recyclable Waste bags.**

Do not use vacuum compression bags (e.g., futon compression bags). Tie the top of the bag securely and keep it light enough to carry with one hand.



**Starting April 1, 2026, designated bags will no longer be required, but you may still use them.**



# Cans and Glass Bottles

(Recyclable Waste)

Put them out in **transparent or semi-transparent plastic bags up to 45 L.**

**\* Note! Do not double-bag cans or glass bottles. No double-bagging**

## 1 Cans

For cans smaller than 18 liters, remove the caps, empty the contents, and rinse the inside with water, before separating them into cans.

Empty the contents and allow them to dry before putting out. Paint cans may be put out as long as the paint is dry enough that it won't pour out.



Rusted or crushed cans should also be included with Cans.

## 2 Glass Bottles

For food and beverage bottles and jars, remove the caps, empty the contents, and rinse the inside with water before separating them into Glass Bottles. Cosmetics bottles may also be put out, as long as they are clean and not made of milky-white glass.

Glass bottles for liquid medicine may be included with beverage bottles. Separate caps into Plastics or Non-Burnable Waste depending on the material.


Spray cans

There are no designated bags, but please sort out batteries, fluorescent tubes, mercury thermometers and blood pressure meters, spray cans, and lighters, and put them out **separately.**


**\* Note! Do not put them out together in the same bag or container. Fluorescent tubes may be put out in their original packaging.**



Spray cans and lighters should be used up as much as possible. Also, **spray cans must not be punctured.** Caps may be left on.



Fluorescent tubes, mercury lamps, etc. (including cracked items)



# Non-Burnable Waste

(Recyclable Waste) (Small Home Appliances, Metals, Glass, Ceramics, etc.)

Put them out in **transparent**

or **semi-transparent**

**plastic bags** up to **45 L**.

Sharp items such as knives and broken glass may be wrapped in paper or double-bagged.  
\* Note! Small home appliances / metals, and glass / ceramics may be put in the same bags, but please separate them as much as possible. **Tie bags tightly.**

## Non-Burnable Waste

Small Home Appliances / Metals, Glass / Ceramics are non-burnable. Please put them out separately as much as possible.


### Metals / Small Home Appliances



Small metal items

(Remove the batteries and put out with Hazardous Waste.)



18-liter cans



Umbrella frames

(Remove vinyl and put out with Burnable Waste.)


Small home appliances



toasters, smartphones, e-cigarettes, etc.

Electric cords

(No need to cut)



Umbrellas will stick out of the bag. Please tie together the parts that stick out.

If the lithium-ion battery cannot be removed, put it out as **Non-Burnable Waste**.

An appliance that fits into a garbage bag (up to 45 L) may be placed in the bag as is. **Do not disassemble it. If the appliance is too large to tie the bag shut, it is considered Large-sized Waste.**

There is a collection service for computers and other small home appliances. Please make use of this too.



### Glass / Ceramic

Overfilling the bag will cause it to tear. **Fill it so that it can be lifted with one hand.**



Glass / Ceramic

If the pieces are not sharp, there is no need to wrap them in paper.




Plant pots

(Cosmetics bottles not made of milky white glass may be put out with Glass Bottles)






Light bulbs

(LED bulbs, glow bulbs, etc.)

Anything that does not fit into a garbage bag (up to 45 L) should be brought in as Large-Sized Waste! Items described below will not be collected.

**Tie bags tightly.**



An item sticking out of a bag or covered by two bags cannot be collected.

Even if an item fits in a bag, it cannot be collected if the bag is taped closed or tied closed with a string.





# Large-Sized Waste

Large items that do not fit into 45 L garbage bags are considered Large-sized Waste. A processing fee of ¥150 per 10 kg is charged.

**\* Note!** If you hire a contractor to transport your large-sized waste, the contractor must be licensed by the town. Please contact the town in advance.

## Wooden items

(Please remove glass or mirrors from furniture as much as possible.)  
Lumber or other construction waste cannot be processed as Large-Sized Waste.





(Cut long items or wide items such as corrugated iron into 1.5 m pieces.)



Items sticking out of a garbage bag are considered Large-Sized Waste.

## Large home appliances, excluding designated home appliances


(Be sure to remove fuel and batteries from heaters, etc.)




Large-Sized Waste must be brought in without disassembling, in its original form.



Electric piano, organ, electone



Electric fan



Heaters



Microwave ovens



Massage chairs



Lights  
(Be sure to remove light bulbs or fluorescent tubes.)



Dehumidifiers, water coolers, etc., may contain CFC refrigerants. If so, please consult the retailer where you purchased the item or an electronics retailer.

Example:  
HFC-134a (with a "C" in its name) is subject to this requirement.




## \* Note!

Some items classified as industrial waste are brought in during cleanups, etc. Dispose of such items properly according to the following points.



Padded chairs, sofas



Spring mattresses



Tatami mats



Futons




Keep the items below dry before bringing them in.



## Main items classified as industrial waste

- Trade tools used in the past
- Waste from old business buildings
- Seedling boxes, cloth crop covers, etc., from professional farms
- Items from a business's renovation work  
→ Ask the construction contractor to collect them.

Please contact an industrial waste disposal company.



**Example: Built-in kitchen units, dishwashers, tatami mats, etc., replaced by the business**



Dispose of it as follows. (Home Appliance Recycling Act)



## Handling Pruned Branches


- Pruned branches may be brought to the **Taki Town Beautification Center**. A processing fee of **¥150 per 10 kg** is charged.

\* Wood waste generated from contractor demolition work or business activities is classified as industrial waste and must be disposed of by the contractor or business. We cannot accept it.



### Items Not Accepted

- Bamboo, roots with soil attached, leaves only, grass clippings, etc.
